Carbon Policy Statement

Broome International Airport (BIA) recognises the impact that carbon emissions are having on the global climate and the importance to reduce emissions arising from BIA's operations. Accordingly, BIA is committed to best practice emissions reporting and reducing carbon emissions across our operations, including by engaging with relevant stakeholders to help reduce carbon emissions.

BIA has joined the Airport Carbon Accreditation program and has set the following longer term policy goals:

- Continued periodic reporting of GHGs in accordance with ACA guidelines.
- Achieve ACA Level 3+ (Neutrality) by 2026.
- Achieve ACA Level 4 (Transformation) by 2030.
- Source at least 50% of BIA's electricity from renewable sources by 2026.
 - This will include both on-site solar generation and procurement of renewable energy.
- Engagement with third parties within the airport to assist them with reducing their GHG emissions.

As part of this commitment, BIA will develop and implement an emissions reduction strategy to help improve energy efficiency, reduce fuel and electricity consumption, and minimise waste across the airport facilities.
